

**Guillermo A. Lemarchand** is a physicist from the University of Buenos Aires, Professor at the Center for Advanced Studies of the University of Buenos Aires and professor of the Science, Technology and Society Program at the National University of Quilmes. He was Chairman of the Board of Advisors for the Science and Technology Committee of the House of Representatives of the Argentine National Congress (2002-2005). He was the organizer of the First Latin American Symposium on Scientists, Peace and Disarmament (1988) and father of the “Buenos Aires Oath” a Hippocratic Oath for Scientists that is used at the graduation ceremonies of the School of Sciences from the University of Buenos Aires since 1988. He was a member of the INES Council (1996-2000) and Coordinator of the Social Responsibility of Science and Engineering Area of INES 2000. He is an Academic Member of the International Academy of Astronautics (Paris) and Secretary of the SETI Committee of the same Academy, Director of the Planetary Society’s SETI Project at the Argentine Institute for Radioastronomy (Conicet) and Co-Director of the First Iberoamerican Graduate School on Astrobiology (Caracas, 1999), Visiting Fellow at the Center for Radiophysics and Space Research of Cornell University working with Carl Sagan (1992-1993). He also works developing mathematical models for technological forecasting and social change, future studies and science and technology policies.
